Beloved in Christ,

How are we sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ in our neighborhood? It's an important question, a critical, urgent question. Jesus commands us to do this. We receive this command at Matthew 28 from Jesus after his resurrection, and just prior to his ascension:

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Our congregation's council has adopted a resolution which encourages us to engage in conversations which will help us more fully practice our Welcoming Statement. Our welcoming Statement is a proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ for our neighborhood, community and the world. It puts context behind our congregation's mission: "Reflecting the Light of Christ in Crystal."

In today's post-Christian world, we are wise to be prepared for a few FAQs (frequently asked questions) in response to our efforts to faithfully share the Good News of Jesus Christ by making disciples of all nations, including our own community.

1. Why should I listen to Christians when they've participated in violent acts (such as the Crusades) and excluded many people who are also marginalized by other institutions?
2. My life is going along very well, so why should I pay attention to what you claim God is saying about my life?
3. How do you know that God even exists?
4. What would give me a reason to think God exists, or that God cares about me?
5. Why are you Christians such hypocrites, telling me that my life could be better with Jesus when you people are just as messed up as everyone else?

Both directly and indirectly, I've encountered questions such as these. As a matter of faith, we are wise to grapple with hard questions, and with what we believe it means to be a disciple (follower and helper), and apostle (sent proclaimer) as a member of the Body of Christ, the church. After all, Jesus Christ calls us in each of our vocations and positions in life to take up our cross and follow him. God commands us to put God first and gives us God's own Holy Spirit so that we can do so.

On Sunday, October 22, our ninth-graders will be affirming their baptisms into the death, resurrection and new life in Christ by making their own the promises made for them at baptism by their parents, sponsors and their church. The entire St. James family of faith will also affirm its baptism into Christ. Affirming our baptisms is not something to be taken lightly. Our congregation's Mission Statement, Welcoming Statement, and ministries express our collective response to God's gracious, loving gift of baptism through which we live in newness of life. Our observance at St. James of the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation recognizes the truths which share in our Lutheran faith.

In this post-Christendom world, we will grow and learn to more effectively share the Good News of Jesus Christ in our neighborhood, community and the world. God's Holy Spirit is alive in each of us. Together, we will grow in our capacity and effectiveness in Sharing Abundant Life.

Reformation 500 1517 - 2017



This year the Lutheran community will be celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Several opportunities are planned for you to learn more about the historical and theological impact of Martin Luther starting with his posting of the 95 Theses on October 31, 1517.

We at St. James will be showing a few movies and documentaries in October, each followed by group discussions. See below for film series.

Sunday, October 29, during Education Hour we will have a Reformation Celebration Fair. This is an intergenerational family event for all ages. There will be activities as well as food tastings, teaching opportunities and more. Join us! If you would like to help with the planning for the Reformation Fair contact Pr. Kristen.

The Worship Committee invites you to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. Three films will be shown - each with a different perspective on Martin Luther and the Reformation. Following the viewing, we will share conversation and pizza.

Oct. 1, 3:00 p.m. - *Rick Steves', Luther and the Reformation*" - 1 hour

"Along with the Renaissance, the Protestant Reformation represented the growing pains of a Europe evolving from the Middle Ages into the modern age. Rick Steves travels in the footsteps of Martin Luther - distilling the story of that bold monk, the chaos of the Reformation, and the larger political, economic, and theological context into an engaging, inspiring, and enlightening hour."

Oct. 15, 3:00 p.m. - *Martin Luther* - PBS Production - 110 minutes

Martin Luther, the man, is the emphasis of this film which was filmed across Europe - from rustic rural Germany to the opulence of the Vatican. "Nailing his treatise to the doors of the Wittenberg Cathedral, this previously obscure German monk changed the world forever. But Luther would do more than revolutionize the Church - he offered the Christian world a new vision of man's relationship with God and, in turn, redefined man's relationship with authority in general."

Stewardship September 2017 Report

Although our spending remains comparable to last year, our giving has fallen off from last year. We look to you for help.

After having a strong July 2017 for Offerings, our August Offerings were our lowest month to date in 2017. For the first eight months of 2017, our Total Mission & Ministry receipts from Offerings and Other Income were \$240,506. Our total spending on Mission & Ministry programs was \$250,844. Our General Operating Funds' actual deficit for the first eight months of 2017 was \$10,338 and resulted in the General Fund having to internally borrow, \$9,800, from other St James' Dedicated Funds as of August 31, 2017.

The Finance and Stewardship Committee encourages you to remember our general fund for Mission & Ministry programs in the upcoming months. Collectively, as individuals and families of our generous congregation at St. James, we can offset this first eight-month deficit with slightly higher stewardship in the rest of 2017.

Items needed are regular bars of wrapped Ivory soap, washcloths, regular size bath towels, receiving blankets, small infant shirts, newborn stocking caps, 2 gallon Ziploc bags, sheets or any color material that can be cut into 36" squares and white sheets or material for making rolled bandages. We are especially short on the bags and white sheets for bandages.


