Pastoral Reflection

Friends in Christ,

Diana and I are and will always be grateful for the opportunity you gave us to celebrate our 40th wedding anniversary. We experienced a rich time of rest, reading and renewal. In the past, our anniversary celebrations have been very low key. Forty years together called for an unforgettable experience. We intentionally created a get-away with far more unplanned time than planned activities and events. Our three planned experiences were a visit to the National Civil Rights Museum in Memphis, a five-day cruise, and a week stay at a condo in Alabama on the shore of the Gulf of Mexico.

We decided to drive rather than fly because it is cheaper and we enjoy driving together. Our stop in Memphis at the Civil Rights Museum was a tremendous blessing. The Museum is housed in the former Lorraine Motel, where the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. was assassinated. When we arrived at about 12:30 pm on a Saturday morning, the line to enter was about 100 yards long, comprised of perhaps 75% African American people. I knew that I was in a holy place and about to experience something deep and important.

Five hours later, I emerged with a clear sense that the struggle for justice, equality and respect for African American people in our nation is tragically far closer to the beginning than the end. However, through the power of Jesus Christ working through God's Holy Spirit, God's Easter people of the resurrection will join the movement of Dr. King and a countless host of faithful people to change the world forever for God's glory. God's Holy Spirit movement through God's Easter people will end racism and all of the other manifestations of sin, death and the power of the devil. During our time on this Earth, we are privileged and blessed when we join in God's great movement of salvation and renewal of all creation.

After the museum visit, we finished our drive to Mobile, Alabama and enjoyed a quiet day of walking through this very old and historic city. On Monday morning, we boarded our cruise ship for a five day cruise, with no phone or internet connections in the beautiful Gulf of Mexico. On the two cruise stops, Progresso and Cozumel, both in Mexico, we toured Mayan ruins and enjoyed beautiful vistas of the Gulf. We were able to enjoy significant time reading while on the cruise, with no distractions. During our anniversary celebration, Diana read five novels and I re-read the New Testament, which was a genuine delight.

Our week at the condo in Gulf Shores Alabama included daily walks on the beach, which is comprised of miles of white sand stretching from Mississippi to Florida, and much time for conversation, naps, and activities such as a visit to a quilt shop (I read the paper) at a woman's house on the outskirts of Gulf Shores and an evening sail boat excursion in which we saw dolphins swimming and leaping from the water. The weather was perfect, and the consistent, soothing sound of the waves crashing onto the brilliant, white sand of the beach nurtured much reflection on God's beautiful creation, and God's timeless, beautiful faithfulness in an ordered, ever-changing creation. Our lives on this earth are a spectacular, but very brief moment of blessing in eternity.

May's pick: The Witches: Salem, 1692 by Stacy Schiff

The Pulitzer Prize-winning author of <u>Cleopatra</u> unpacks the mystery of the Salem Witch Trials. It began in 1692, over an exceptionally raw Massachusetts winter, when a minister's daughter began to scream and convulse. It ended less than a year later, but not before 19 men and women had been hanged and an elderly man crushed to death. The panic spread quickly, involving the most educated men and prominent politicians in the colony. Neighbors accused neighbors, parents and children each other. Aside from suffrage, the Salem Witch Trials represent the only moment when women played the central role in American history. <u>The Witches</u> is Stacy Schiff's account of this fantastical story - the first great American mystery unveiled fully for the first time.
