## A Note from Pastor David...

The December 15 electronic news of the Minneapolis Area Synod made the official announcement of all bishop nominees for our Synod Assembly February 16-18 election. I join seventeen other pastors on the list plus anyone else who is nominated in the first round of the election.

What does this nomination mean for St. James and me? First, it says that our synod recognizes St. James and her pastors as leaders for our synod. Former St. James pastor Nancy Bence is also on the list. And two of our former pastors, David Olson and Gary Knutson, have served the ELCA as bishops. Secondly, it means that we are a significant part of the process of electing a new bishop. I invite your ongoing prayers for our synod, all the nominees, and our delegates Dick Olson, Kaitlyn Ferguson, Margaret Thomsen, and pastors.

What does the nomination *not* mean? It does not mean that I am leaving St. James or that I want to leave St. James. To the contrary, I absolutely love it here. You all occupy a very special place in my heart, and I am exceedingly energized to partner with you in our response to God's calling and promise. I think our staff and our congregation are top-notch and our future together is very bright!

I will continue to serve you to the best of my abilities throughout this process and synod discernment, offering *our* generous support and leadership for the life and mission we share as the Minneapolis Area Synod-ELCA. God bless us all in this New Year.

## Outreach Partner: Loaves & Fishes

Loaves & Fishes mission statement is to provide nutritious meals to people who are hungry in the Twin Cities metro area in an atmosphere of hospitality. Locations are in areas where it is needed most. Loaves & Fishes develops joint ventures with like-minded organizations to assist guests with other basic needs and help them to become self-sufficient.

St. James, along with House of Hope serves the third Thursday of every month. The meal is prepared at 2:00 p.m. and servers come at 5:00 p.m. This team serves at River of Life Lutheran Church (22nd & Fremont Ave N).

During 2011, 1,930 meals were served at a cost of \$.73 per meal. The cost to each church was \$705.05. St. James sets aside the month of January to raise funds for this outreach program. ## Book Club News “The Page Turners”

**January’s Pick:** Canoeing with the Cree by Eric Sevareid. In 1930, two novice paddlers – Eric Sevareid and Walter C. Port – launched a secondhand 18-foot canvas canoe into the Minnesota River at Fort Snelling for an ambitious summer-long journey from Minneapolis to Hudson Bay. Without benefit of radio, motor, or good maps, the teenagers made their way over 2,250 miles of rivers, lakes, and difficult portages. Nearly four months later, after shooting hundreds of sets of rapids and surviving exceedingly bad conditions and even worse advice, the ragged, hungry adventurers arrived in York Factory on Hudson Bay. This is Sevareid’s classic account of this youthful odyssey. The newspaper stories that Sevareid wrote on this trip launched his distinguished journalism career, which included more than a decade as a television correspondent and commentator on the CBS Evening News.
