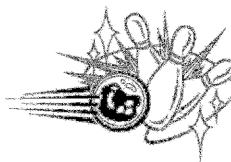

Theology for Everyone

Dr. Douglas Hugg, Philosophy Professor at Gustavus Adolphus College, will present a lay theology class “How Do Our Words Work?! ... The ‘God Language’ of Bonhoeffer, Kierkegaard & Wittgenstein” at St. James.

Dr. Huff will provide some of the history and the stories from the lives of three philosophers-thinkers-theologians-teachers and (in his own words): “I am thinking about doing a discussion as to how each thinker, in his own way, draws a fairly sharp demarcation between religion and ethics (morals/principles) for the sake of religion.” Each session will include time for conversation and questions.
